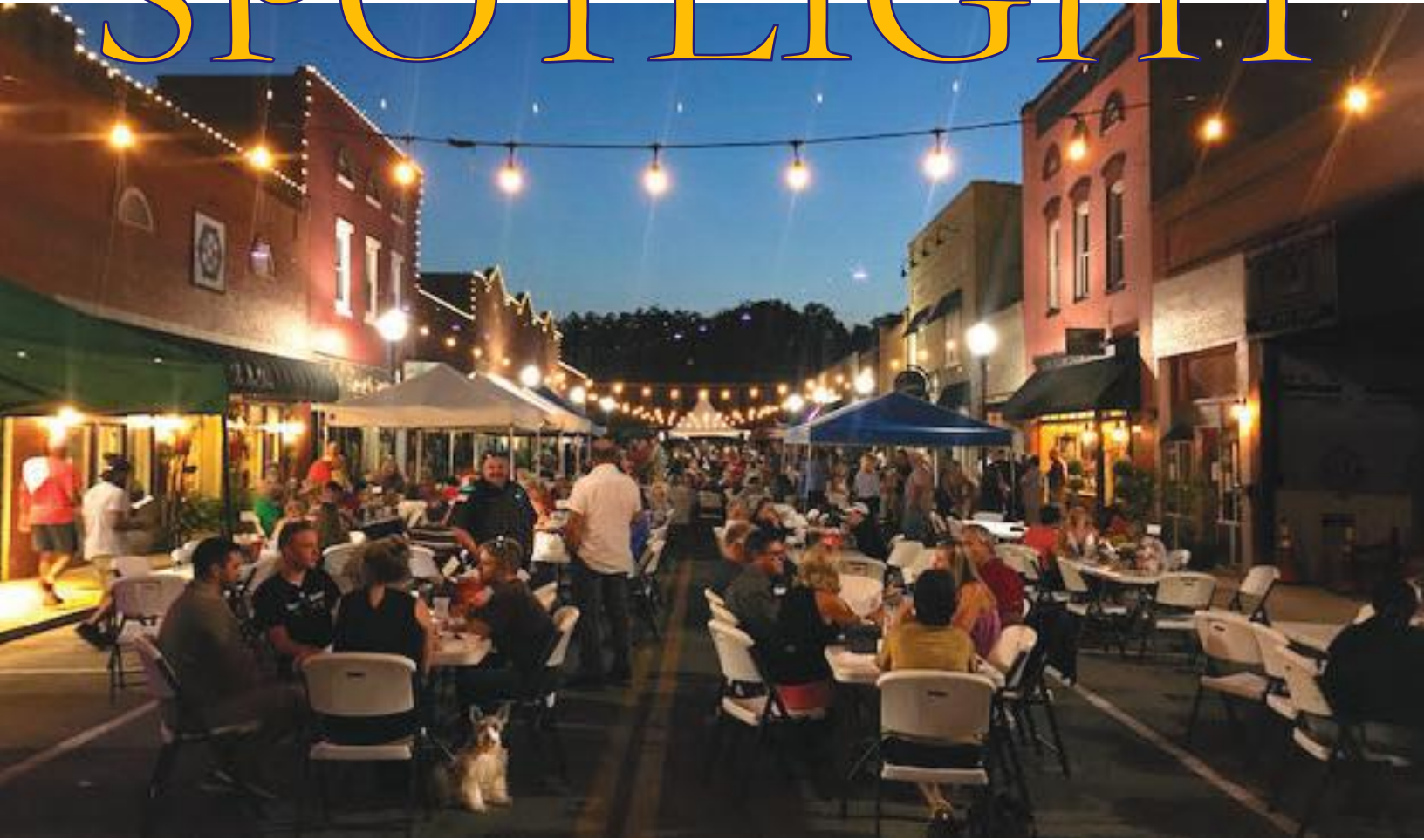

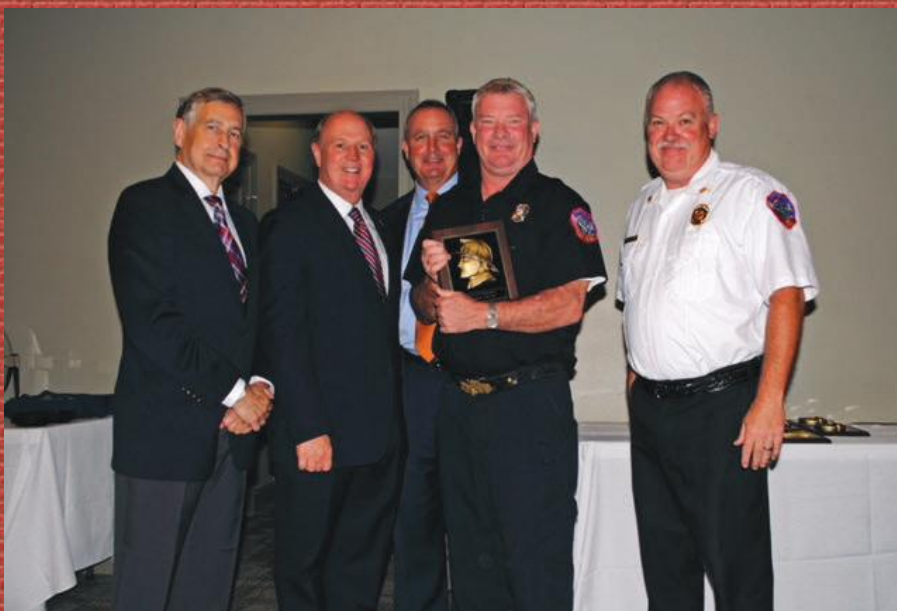

Please accept our apologies for the inconvenience this temporary closure may cause. We appreciate and thank you for your patience as we make these necessary road improvements.

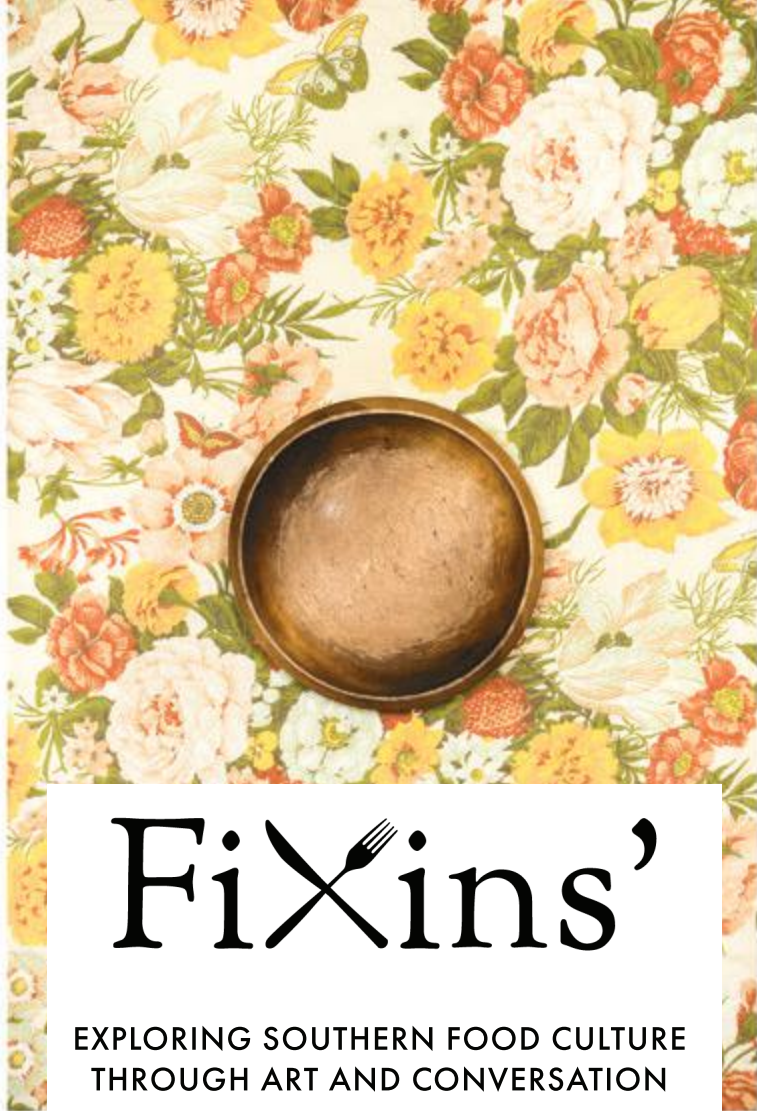

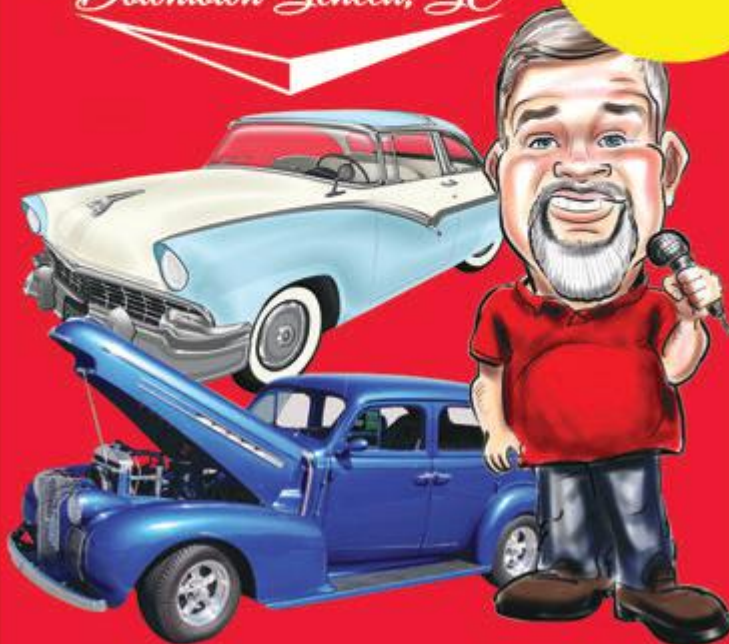
