City announces plans for new "Storybook Trail Park" for children

The City of Seneca plans to create a new "Storybook Trail Park" to be located adjacent to the Seneca branch of the Oconee County Public Library on East South 2nd Street in downtown Seneca.

The ADA accessible park will be open for children of all levels and will include pollinator plants to create a natural habitat for butterflies, moths, and other common species of lepidoptera insect order. The City has enlisted the help of Morgan Sisk, a Clemson University junior majoring in landscape architecture, to assist with the park's design.

Children and their adult guardians will be able to follow along pathways lined with pages from storybooks to read. While at the park, children will have opportunities to create chalk artwork, learn about the lives and importance of butterflies and other pollinators, practice simple math skills, and to enjoy the beauty of art and nature throughout the park. The muraled fence from the former Monarch Park will be incorporated into the park's design. The fence was created as a scout project by a former Boy Scout, students from Seneca Middle School and the Hamilton Career Center, Seneca United Way volunteers, and the Blue Ridge Art Center. The park's proximity to the library will provide an opportunity for children to visit with an accompanying adult to further learn and explore their interest by utilizing the many offerings available to them through the county's public library.


The Storybook Trail Park will be a City of Seneca project in partnership with Oconee County Public library and the Blue Ridge Arts Center, and upon completion, will be the City's first STEAM project (science, technology, engineering, arts, and math). The park represents the City's department of Arts, History, and Culture's first projects undertaken to support the goal of incorporating art and education into some of the City's undeveloped and underdeveloped green spaces and providing enjoyable outdoor experiences for children, youth, and families.

Phase one development of the Storybook Trail Park is scheduled to begin sometime later this year.









UPDATES ON CITY PROJECTS

Harper's Plaza - work will begin in August on the renovation of the former Harper's Five & Dime store. Plans include a city park and retail spaces that will be available to sell to interested businesses.

Kimbrell's - A \$10 million grant for a project was announced last month, an effort that was spearheaded by State House Rep. Bill Sandifer. The grant will allow the City to transform the building into a new visual and performing arts center with 714 seats. Grant funds should be available sometime in October and will be added to a previous state grant of \$2.5 million.

Amphitheater Grant - The City is awaiting word on the Appalachian Regional Commission's decision on a \$500,000 grant request submitted earlier this spring which would be used to build an outdoor amphitheater on City property. That decision is expected late this summer.

New Roof for Gignilliat Center - will allow remodeling of several areas to begin, including the new City Archives.

Shaver Walking Track - work will begin in late July or early August to start cutting in the new base of the Shaver Recreation Complex Walking track after the decision was made by the City to expand the size of Shaver's ballfields. The walking track will still be 1.1 or 1.2 miles.

Seneca Dog Park - The City received word on August 1st that Seneca has been named a finalist in the Pet Safe grant contest which would bring the park a \$25,000 grant if Seneca is one of the top finishers in the contest. The City is asking for help in this phase of the grant contest as the number of online votes will determine whether or not the dog park is awarded the grant.






