'Everything for everyone' Dear Rosie Boutique thriving in year three in downtown Seneca

The odds were undoubtedly stacked against Erica Rowland when she opened Dear Rosie Boutique almost three years ago in downtown Seneca.

The Covid-19 pandemic was still rampant in the fall of 2020, but Rowland knew she wanted to start a business and be downtown. So, she made it happen and the results continue to pay off to this day.

"When I wanted a location for our store, I knew I wanted to be downtown," Rowland said inside her boutique at II5 N. Townville Street, conveniently located at the intersection with Ram Cat Alley. "There was no other option. I didn't look anywhere else."

The Townville native started work in Oconee County when she was 15. She met her husband in the Golden Corner, and became a small business owner at age 27. The reason she didn't look anywhere else to start her business was because she wanted to mimic shopping experiences she had during her many visits to Clayton, Georgia.

"Their downtown is just so picture perfect and when I was looking for a place, I wanted to recreate that kind of feel and downtown Seneca had picked up a bit," Rowland said. Jazz on the Alley, she said, is always a business booster with ever-growing crowds; as well as the store's perfect location near the heart of it all.

With love, sweat and handiwork - which was help from her husband and father - the boutique is vibrant, well-stocked, and welcoming to all customers who stop in.

Dear Rosie, named to honor her late grandmother Rosie, sells jewelry, candles, bags, shoes and even popcorn. But, the main attraction for shoppers would be clothes, clothes, and more clothes. That includes athleisure, date night dresses and professional outfits for teachers.

"We try to have everything for everyone in every size," Rowland said. "We normally start at a woman's small and go through a 3XL. We're trying to cater to everyone. I have had everything from a lady having her 90th birthday come in and get a outfit, to preteens getting their first day of school outfit. I try to keep a good mix of things that work for teachers, other business owners, and moms."

Rowland has expanded the store's digital footprint, allowing customers to shop collections online at **shopdearrosie.com** or place orders to be picked up in-store. Apparel for men even has its own wall section, a new addition to the store, which includes polos, swim trunks, tumbler cups, and hats, including the popular Burlebo brand.

"We do have their wives and girlfriends in here and it makes it easy for them to find gifts for a special occasion," Rowland said. "We do have men that come in with their wives and now they have a space up here."

An ardent supporter of the Seneca Business Development Support Center (SBDSC), Rowland now sits on the organization's board. She praised the SBDSC for connecting area businesses.

"Some things I might not carry, but I can send somebody else a recommendation of where to go," she said. "I love to be able to give recommendations -- I've met some really nice people through that. I think it's also great that businesses get an advertisement package that you don't necessarily have to do all the work by yourself."
