When you have 14 departments reporting directly to one person, it is understandably difficult to give each one the attention and time that each needs to maintain a high level of quality in all aspects of city services. That's exactly the dilemma City Administrator Scott Moulder has faced each day for six years as the city of Seneca continues to grow in popularity, services, size, and economic diversity.

Seneca's mayor and city council recognized the need for an expanded management team and responded to Moulder's request for the addition of two assistant city administrators. With the new team in place, city departments have been divided equally between the three city administrators, with the goal of maintaining open and close communication between the management team and all the city departments.

Moulder named former city finance director Josh Riches as one of the assistant administrators, and Ryan Thomas recently came on board as the second assistant city administrator. Thomas was an assistant city manager in Greenwood for the past five years. Danielle Smith, former assistant city finance officer, has stepped into the position as city finance director. All have hit the ground running and are looking forward to positive changes on the horizon for the City of Seneca.

Moulder feels strongly that the City runs best when all departments are working together for common goals.

"What we do is cross departmental," he said. "We don't have clear departmental lines where we don't touch each other. It's really going to be a three-pronged approach so that all three administrators and department directors are working together as a unified team."
