Utility Work on Highway 130

If you travel Highway 130 between the Keowee Key area and the City of Seneca, you may have wondered about work and construction occurring on the sides of the highway. Construction of a 1,000,000 gallon elevated storage tank and approximately 840 linear feet of a 12-inch waterline has been underway for several weeks now.



A bid was issued last year for the site work/construction of the water storage tank and water line and will benefit Duke Energy, Keowee Key, the Town of Salem, and residents between Doug Hollow Road and the City of Seneca.

An anticipated completion date is second quarter 2026.



CATbus Update: After sending out Request for Proposals, the City of Seneca has selected Senior Solutions to provide on-demand transportation services within the City. Contracts are in the development stages, and during this process, CATbus service will continue to run as normal.


